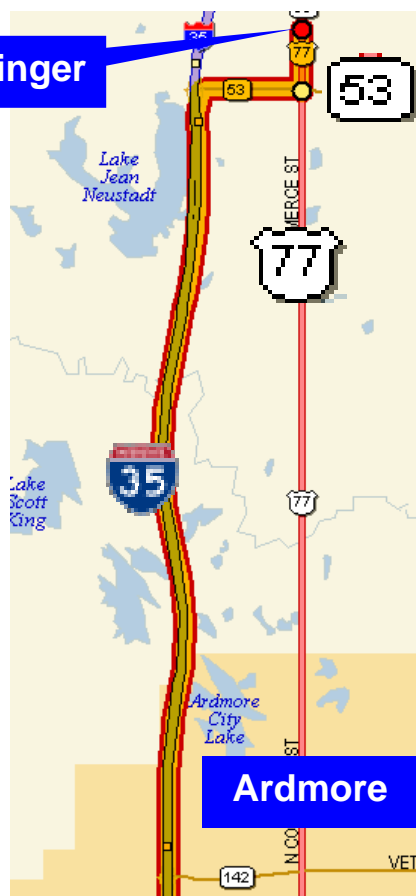

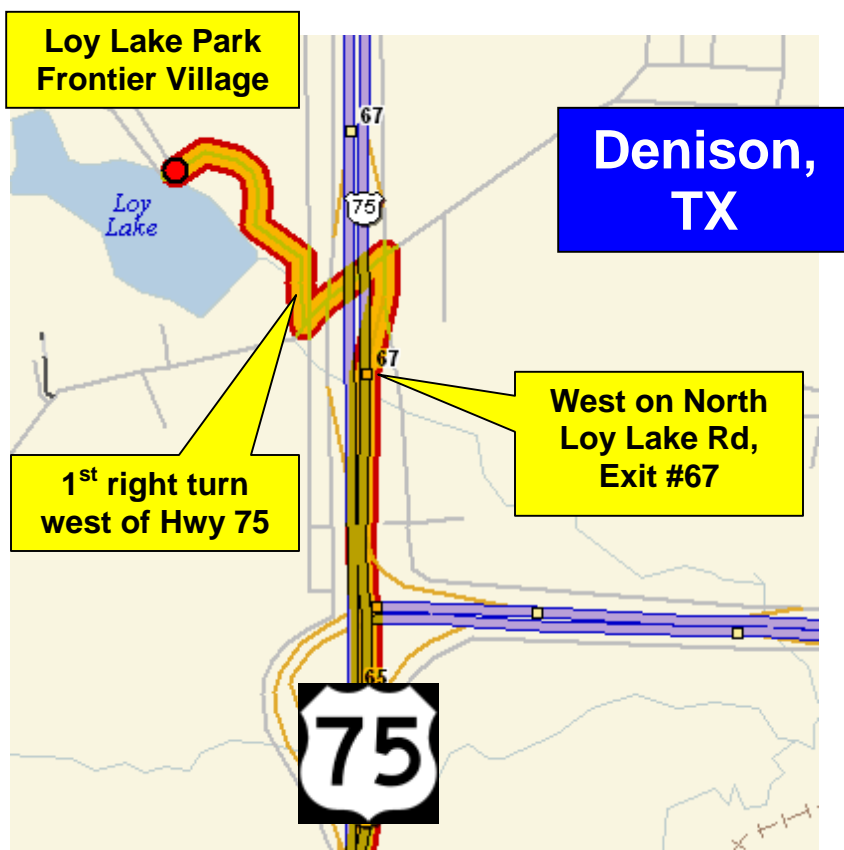

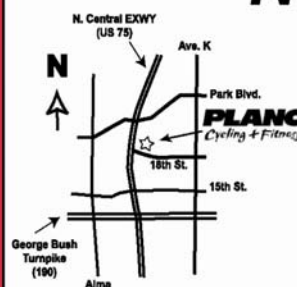

We were approached several weeks ago by the National Federation of the Blind (NFB) to do a ride to accommodate visually impaired cyclists. The NFB will be having its national convention at the Hilton Anatole the first week in July. We will be doing a ride in which we provide tandems, captains, and support to set up bikes, with visually impaired riders on the back of the tandems. This is a great opportunity for the club to support the visually impaired segment of our society. Please show up and support this!

DATE: Wednesday, July 5, 2006
TIME: 6:00 PM
PLACE: White Rock Lake – the Bath House Cultural Center
RIDE LEADERS: Jimmy & Kelly Jimmy Duval
ORGANIZER: Warren & Audre Casteel backed up by Roane & Juanita Logan.
SUPPORT: Plano Cycling & Fitness will provide their van, a mechanic, pedals, sports drink, bike fitting, and general support
DISTANCE: Highly variable depending on the desires and abilities of the NFB riders. I think the maximum distance would be 1 lap of White Rock Lake (10 miles)
DINNER: Jimmy & Kelly will find a local restaurant for us to gather at after the event.

OFFICER/COMMITTEE REPORTS

Coordinators: Roane Logan opened the meeting by thanking Rusty Tether and Jane for hosting the meeting.

DATES-Line Editors: Roane commended the Jenkins for doing such a great job with the newsletter. There was no further report regarding the DATES-Line.

Secretaries: The minutes from the February 19, 2006 annual meeting were unanimously approved.

Ride Coordinators: Carol Croy thanked all the teams who have led a ride this year. She commented that 3 rides this year have been rained out. Because the May campout ride conflicts with the Red River Road Kill Rally in Oklahoma, it was agreed that the May campout ride will be rescheduled to September.

Upcoming events were reviewed, including the SWTR in Ardmore, the "Edgewood 80" in Edgewood, and a possible ride in Bonham. It was decided that the DATES New Member Ride will not be held this year.

There was discussion regarding the possibility of DATES sponsoring a charity ride, or becoming the sponsor of an existing one.

Juanita Logan inquired whether there is interest in an after-work ride in Plano or in North Dallas. There is currently a 20-mile ride each Wednesday at 6:00 p.m. from Valley View Park (1 block north of 635 on the east side of Hillcrest). There is a 32-mile "guys ride" each Tuesday at 5:30 p.m. leaving from Office Depot, Forest & Central in Dallas.

Membership: Kevin Vinson reported that the club has 69 active teams including 6 new teams, plus 8 honorary teams. The group discussed the "bike buddy" option offered to new members and how this should best be implemented. Kevin also mentioned that the Dallas Morning News conducted a survey of bike clubs located throughout the DFW area; he will put the link to the survey results in the DATES-Line.

Webmasters: No new report.

Treasurers: Roane gave the treasurer's report in John McManus' absence. There was discussion of various projects to which DATES might consider contributing; nothing definitive was decided on this subject.
