T. V. Munson began agricultural experiments with the wild Texas grapes he found in Grayson County during the 1870's. A decade later, French farmers panicked as their grape vines were destroyed by a new disease. Mr. Munson sent some of his hardy Texas vines to France where they were crossed with the French vines, saving the French wine industry. He was subsequently awarded the French Legion of Honor.

LIABILITY RELEASE

All riders must sign a waiver of claim below to become members and participate in Double DATES activities. A Parent or guardian must sign for riders under 18 years of age.

I ACKNOWLEDGE THAT BY SIGNING THIS DOCUMENT, I AM RELEASING THE DOUBLE DATES, ITS MEMBERS, OFFICERS, AND AGENTS FROM LIABILITY. THIS RELEASE IS A CONTRACT WITH LEGAL CONSEQUENCES, AND I HAVE READ IT CAREFULLY BEFORE SIGNING.

I acknowledge that cycling is an inherently dangerous sport and fully realize the dangers of participating in group rides. I FULLY ASSUME THE RISKS ASSOCIATED WITH SUCH PARTICIPATION.

For myself, my heirs, executors, administrators, legal representatives, assignees, and successors in interest (collectively "Successors"), I HEREBY WAIVE, RELEASE, DISCHARGE, HOLD HARMLESS, PROMISE NOT TO SUE, AND INDEMNIFY the Double DATES, its members, ride leaders or hosts and officers (collectively the "Released Parties") from any and all rights and claims including claims arising from the released parties' own negligence, gross negligence or intentional conduct, which I have or which may hereafter accrue to me, and from any and all damages which may be sustained by me directly or indirectly in connection with, or arising out of, my participation in or association with an event sponsored by Double DATES.

I understand and agree that situations may arise during a ride that may be beyond the immediate control of the leader(s) or host(s), and I must continually ride so as to endanger neither others nor myself. I accept responsibility for the condition and adequacy of my own bicycle equipment. I will wear a helmet that satisfies the requirements of the ANSI Snell regulations that can protect against serious head injury, and I assume all responsibility and liability for the selection of such a helmet. I have no physical or medical condition that to my knowledge would endanger others or myself if I participate in Double DATES rides or would interfere with my ability to participate in such rides. I agree that should I or my successors assert my claim in contravention of this agreement, the asserting party shall be liable for the expenses (including legal fees) incurred by the other party or parties in defending.

I understand that a parent or responsible adult must accompany all riders under the age of 18 on any Double DATES ride. If I am a minor, my parent or guardian also is signing on my behalf and we both agree to be bound by the terms of this waiver and release.



Synopsis: SAG'ed, overnight camping ride. Richardson Bike Mart to Cedar Hill State Park and return, about 40 miles each day. Way cool, very fun!

Details: This ride is a great first tandem tour, a fun, different way to spend time tandeming together and, if all your recent tours have been in Tuscany or the Loire Valley, a super way to reconnect with our very own interesting, beautiful area. The daily miles are short and we'll stop and have fun and do some history talks along the way. Tandems will shove off from RBM's parking lot around 9:30 or so Saturday morning and ride across the neighborhoods and through the history of Dallas. We'll stick together (but there'll be maps!) at an easy pace and have a lot of fun. The group will spend the night camping at Cedar Hill State Park, and ride back on Sunday. Despite the urban location of the ride, the route is quiet and low traffic.

Route highlights:

Saturday: Richardson Bike Mart, Cottonwood Park, North Dallas, Park Cities, West End, School Book Depository, Trinity River, Oak Cliff, Bishop Arts District, Jefferson Mercado, Texas Theater, Mountain View College, the big hill, Mountain Creek Lake, National Cemetery, Cedar Hill.

Sunday: Kiest Park, Dallas Zoo, Arts District, Swiss Avenue, White Rock Lake.

Meals: Lunch in West End. Saturday evening and Sunday breakfast group meals cooked at State Park. Group lunch during return ride.

Denton County Ride
Sunday, August 20th, 2006
Ride Report by Kevin Vinson

The Denton County Ride was hosted by Mitch & Leslie Frank. Even with the current weather we have had, there were nine couples and one single. We met at Rockledge Park on Lake Grapevine at 7:30 AM. Linda and I were commenting on how we had no idea this park existed. This was a popular meeting area for the mountain bikers and triathletes as well. Once everyone assembled, Mitch & Leslie led us out of the park. Three route options were available; 35, 40, and 50 miles

Since Linda and I will be traveling to Wichita Falls for the Hotter N' Hell Hundred, we decided on the 50-mile route. We were joined by Team Bryant and Team Jenkins. We looked at this ride as a training ride for the HHH since we have not been on the tandem as much as we have on our singles. We couldn't have picked a better route to "train" on. LOL! This route offered a nice helping of hills, rolling hills, and flat terrain. The route took us north from Lake Grapevine through Flower Mound, Double Oak, and Copper Canyon.

It was in Copper Canyon where we rejoined the other teams. We were able to visit with everyone at this point of the ride. After several miles, we again split off from the main group. From here, we made our way up to Denton. Once we hit FM 1830, we began heading west. This point of the route would take us as far west as Robson Ranch. Once we passed Robson Ranch, we made a left on Faught Road, going south. After about a mile, we made another left on Old Justin Road, going east. This took us back across I-35W to US 377.

Linda and I felt pretty good that we were still hanging with Team Jenkins and Team Bryant. We have a feeling they were being easy on us. LOL! Team Bryant was still feeling the effects of their cycling trips to California and Michigan. As for Team Jenkins, they had been riding 100 miles for the last three weekends as part of their training for the HHH. As you can see, we caught them at a good time. LOL!

Once we hit US-377, we made our way south. The route called for us to make a left on Harpole. Ronny & Nanette suggested we make a stop at the "Marble Entry" store. This store was located less than a mile south of Harpole on the east side of US-377. Come to find out, this is an old general store with an aggregate concrete slab with marbles embedded. I have never seen anything like it. This stop gave us a chance to re-fuel for the remaining ride. At this point, we were at 30 miles.

Once the six of us had a chance to re-fuel, we got back on the bikes and made our way north on US-377 to Harpole. This point of the route took us east through Justin and Argyle. Feeling refreshed, the six of us were able to maintain a very nice pace. Making our way south in a roundabout way, we rode through Bartonville, Flower Mound, and finally Grapevine. At the 40 mile mark, we came across Team Glenz. They had experienced a flat. We stopped to assist and then resumed our ride. Now at four teams, we made our way through the various residential areas in Flower Mound. Once we entered the Grapevine city limits, we were just minutes from Rockledge Park.

We really enjoyed the ride. We had a nice time riding with Team Jenkins and Team Bryant. That continued when we picked up Team Glenz. As for the route, we loved it. It just so happened that Linda and I rode a portion of the route on our singles the day before. The roads are very good with some very nice scenery. It was great seeing all of the cyclists out and about throughout the ride. Even all the way out by Robson Ranch, we encountered quite a few cyclists. We highly recommend this ride in the future. As a matter of fact, Linda and I are going to use it in the future as a training ride.

It was great seeing all the DATES teams as well. Considering the weather we have been having here in the DFW area, Linda and I felt it was a very nice turnout. Mitch & Leslie did an excellent job of hosting this ride. They provided beverages and snacks before and after the ride. They provided very detailed maps and cue sheets. I will definitely be adding this ride to the routes library. Kudos to Mitch & Leslie for a great day of riding. We look forward to this ride as a DATES event in the future.
